# 4<sup>th</sup> point: **Problems and concerns generated by COVID-19:**

- Assessment of problems and responses on on-going residency programs
- The concerns of EBVS on the previous point and on this year Exams
- This year ECVCN Exam will be postponed to December 2 and 3 and will be performed using Examsoft® an online tool. Marianne Diez (new exam committee chair) will be the superuser to this tool.
- Exam candidates that withdraw their application till 2 weeks prior to the 2020 Exam will not have to pay next time they apply to do the exam and this year will not count for the 8 yrs time length deadline to successfully get the diplomate status.

5<sup>th</sup> point: **Exam questions procedure:** it was put to discussion if making the exam questions in groups (tested this year) should be maintained or changed. It was also given to consideration that Ellen Kienzle, the administrator of the new method, should have someone else to help her.

# About the experience till now

• The overall interventions pointed out their experience was positive. The main concerns were how to deal with the elements that are not contributing, the non-existing feedback on what were the results, i.e. this method allows to collect more questions? Better questions?

### How to continue in the future:

- It would be welcome to have more feedback about the performance of the new method. It was agreed that the experiment should continue for one more year.
- 6<sup>th</sup> point: Call of attention for the fact that it is mandatory from EBVS **2 reference letters for re-certification.**
- 7<sup>th</sup> point: Information that the board is working in the **strategic plan** that is due in November this year.
- 8<sup>th</sup> point: The ECVCN and ESVCN are working together to achieve common goals.

  Namely support the residency class and the residents, besides to promote the specialty. With this goals ESVCN offered space in their website to publish case reports from residents.

The overall interventions agreed with the *benefits*, *namely*:

- 1 Promote the specialty
- 2 Help residents to train their skills in dealing with cases in practice and to prepare themselves to the Exam

### **Main concerns** raised by interventions were:

- 1. Were these publications considered to be full papers for the credentials
- 2. All residents would have similar criteria in the judgment of their case reports whether submitted to credentials committee or to be published in ESVCN website.

The main concerns were addressed by Annette Liesegang, Britta Dobenecker and Stefanie Handl:

- 1 No, these publications are only considered to be case reports.
- 2 Yes, because the case reports should be submitted using the case report format endorsed by the credentials committee and the peer review of the

case reports submitted to ESVCN website will be done by 2 reviewers from ESVCN but includes also a member of the credentials committee

After the discussion, it was put to voting whether the publication of case reports from ECVCN residents should be put in practice. The proposal was approved with no votes against it.

9<sup>th</sup> point: The **Travel Grant for Externship was not active due to the COVID 19**. This grand of 500-1000 euro goal is to help residents visit different institutions and will be kept open to be used when the COVID situation allows it.

10<sup>th</sup> point: The **Sponsors of the College and the Residency class.** This year they were: Nestle Purina, Royal Canin, ESVCN and the Institute of Animal Nutrition, University of Zurich (with Zoom support).

The college is in negotiations with other companies for future sponsorship and it was suggested that Dechra would be approached by the secretary of the ECVCN in this regard.

# 11th point: Overview on Residency class:

- Organized by Anne Mösseler (vice-president)
- 36 attendees because Exam candidates joined.
- 9 case reports (1st and 2nd year residents)
- 3 reviews (3rd year resident)
- Guest speakers: Prof. Zentek, Dr. Harris
- Best case report (Diana Brozic: *Long-term enteral nutrition in a kitten*) and best review (Marco Fantinati: *Dietary copper*) awards (Purina Sponsorship) will be presented at ESVCN meeting.

12<sup>th</sup> point: **EBVS report strategy.** This year the meeting was held online in April 23-24. The main goals of the EBVS for the European specialists and the colleges for the period 2020-2025 are:

- Achieve Recognition
- Sitmulate growth
- Promote the impact and influence of vet specialists
- Assure quality of training and support residents

To achieve this goals EBVS wants that the 5-year (2020-2025) strategic plan include strategies to increase the number of specialists, particularly in certain areas of Europe where they are currently under-represented. The EBVS P&Ps state that "internationally recognized" colleagues are allowed to sit the college exam without undertaking a residency. Thus, it is very important that our college defines what we consider an "internationally recognized expert".

This issue raised some concerns and discussion but Cecilia Villaverde clarified that we can define in which areas we would like to have more specialists and when the residency is not a possibility because of location or lack of specialists in the field, we could evaluate the prior work experience, qualifications or training and attribute the "internationally recognized expert" status. The "internationally recognized expert" could then apply for the college exam without having to do the Residency.

The assembly was challenged to submit suggestions for the characterization of an "internationally recognized expert"

# 13<sup>th</sup> point: Overview Board: Future

- Develop strategic plan e.g. position statements (communication committee)
  → Annette Liesegang
- Separate website no longer with ESVCN new!!
- Plan: common website under EBVS hopefully launched December 2020 (delay due to Covid19)
- Focus on improving resident performance
  - Expand residency class to Monday afternoon for exam training
  - Support of residents in language
  - Support for supervisors
  - Email updates on new papers (e.g. every 3 months, rotation among diplomates)
  - Limit resident training if X latest candidates not successful?
